

Parliamentary enquiry submissions

Yesterday the evidence submitted to the ongoing parliamentary enquiry into the SCRO was published on the parliamentary website.

Although disagreeing substantially with much of the evidence it has always been the policy of this website to publish as much information as possible without redaction or alteration. Readers are then able to make up their own minds as to the credibility they give to it.

In areas where we disagree substantially with statements e.g. Messrs Swann and Russell the fact that they will have to stand by their statements as enquiry witnesses offers some form of protection to those maligned by them.

Two of the witnesses **Les Brown** and **Alistair Watson** however are not scheduled to give evidence and will not be subject to examination before the enquiry. We are advised that publication of their statements might give rise to future legal action as it would not be covered by parliamentary privilege. Some of Mr Brown's evidence has been described as 'lies' by Iain McKie and lawyers will be challenging him for the evidence to back up his statements.
